

NEW IN THE BUILDING

Oh my goodness! PLEASE look at all we have in the building! I really overbought and I'm not sure how we are going to display it all! My employees just give me a "look" every time a shipment arrives. There are some great new items this year. We have components for a "Make Your Own Garden Stake". Each one created will be your own original. These are really fun to do, and look sharp! We also added a line of quality garden flags, stands and poles. Of course we have lots of new fairy merchandise. New fairies, houses, fairy items in mini sizes and more. We have a lot of new solar merchandise: glow in the dark items, and pretty hanging art. There is also a new dark tent so you can see them light up!

NEW ROSE SELECTIONS FOR 2016

We have a new Downton Abbey Rose to join last year's 'Anna's Promise'. This dark pink Hybrid Tea Rose is called '**Pretty Lady Rose**'. If you miss the TV show, you can remember it with their roses!. There is a uniquely colored red Hybrid Tea, '**Smokin' Hot**' a white with pink picotee Grandiflora, '**Miss Congeniality**', and a red shrub rose '**Take it Easy**' that joins the Living Easy series. These are the newest roses for 2016, and we have a lot of great other roses as well. Check out the clean disease resistant foliage on '**Crescendo**' and '**Frances Meiland**', and the ever popular '**Ketchup & Mustard**' with a bicolor bloom!



In the Home Run series (which are disease resistant and carefree like the Knock Out roses), there is a new variety, '**Watercolors Home Run**', which changes from yellow gold to blushing pink. And of course we have the whole family of Knock Out and Home Run Roses available as well as many other beautiful colors in traditional rose varieties.

ANNUALS TO TRY IN 2016

There is a new **Celosia 'Dragon Breath'** (Cockscomb) that I thought was spectacular at last summers' plant shows. It has fiery red foliage to match its's red plume type blooms.

Last year we grew some '**Lucky' Lantana** which were a bit larger than our dwarf '**Bandana**' series but more controlled than the large '**Confetti**' & '**Dallas Red**'. We liked them a lot, so we grew more of them this year. We also sold out quickly last year of the Sun tolerant **Impatiens** which are disease resistant as well, both the '**Sunpatiens**' and the '**Big Bounce**', so we have more of them this year.

We have several **Alocasias** and **Colocasias**, better known as Elephant Ears. I really like the unique leaf on **Alocasia 'Amazonica'**, and we have several **Black Elephant Ear Varieties** as well as the '**Thailand Giant**' – a HUGE Elephant Ear!

Cannova Cannas were new to us last year. These seed grown Cannas are very pretty, branch well, get 30 – 48" tall, and make great plants for the center of a larger pot. We have about 5 different colors.

In the tropical plant line, we have a couple of **Banana Trees**, including '**Basjoo**' which is hardy for our area – it can be planted in the ground and will come back from year to year. There is also **Ensete or Red Abyssinian Banana** which is not a true banana, but it looks like one with very attractive bronze red leaves.

Each year when I travel, I am always influenced by the plants I see. This year, we have **Abutilon 'Thompsonii'** a variegated leaf flowering Maple I saw as topiary trees!, **Trumpet Vine 'Madame Galen'**(perennial) which is great for hummingbirds, **Variegated Potato vine** that has pretty white bloom clusters, and **Creeping Fig** which would be a great plant for fairy gardens. They are all plants I loved in the Italian Lake District last year.

There are a couple of new **Calibrachoa/ Million Bells** that are very pretty: '**Holy Moly**' a yellow and red flower and my favorite, '**Evening Star**', a purple flower with a yellow star in the throat.

Last year '**Jolt' Dianthus** was an All-America Selection winner. They boasted wonderful glossy foliage and bloomed all summer, so I grew 2 varieties this year, '**Pink**' and '**Cherry**'. They have nice 3-4 inch flower heads which are good in pots or the ground, and make great cut flowers as well.

There is a cool new **Petunia** called '**Night Sky**'. It is purple with white dots resembling stars...these will probably be gone quickly! Other new petunias are '**Yellow Easy Wave**' and one called '**Black Cherry**'. We also brought back '**Raspberry Blast**' this year. You just can't beat petunias for ease of care and lots of color all summer long.

In walking through the greenhouse, '**Mango Orange' Verbena** caught my eye for its unique color. '**Red Empress**' Verbena has HUGE blooms that are very attractive.


We have a new **Sweet Potato Vine 'Sweet Caroline Red'** with a red- ish leaf color, and a lot of different **Dahlias**, many with the dark leaves and single blooms you seem to love. We also have a couple of varieties of large **Dahlia** plants from tubers '**Go Go Speckled Pink**' and '**Go Go Red**'. Dahlias are great in the ground or in pots.



We are trying a plant we grew a couple of years ago, with limited success, **Digiplexis 'Illumination Flame'** it is supposed to be a great flowering plant all summer long. It is a cross between two different foxglove species. For us it is an annual. All of the garden companies rave about it as being spectacular! For us – it grew well, but didn't bloom. The problem seems to be that they need a cold treatment or "vernalization" before they will bloom. These plants have been vernalized, so we will hopefully see great results this time around! The tall spike blooms are in glowing colors of pink and yellow.

We always have a great selection of **succulents**, and this year is no different. There are a lot of perennial succulents (blue price tags) and tender succulents (white price tags), and we also have some great assortments coming a bit later potted up in very unique containers. I found these last summer at a plant show, and am excited to see which shapes and containers they send!

As usual, the greenhouses are bursting at the seams, so come see all these plants as well as the ones I didn't mention!


2016 IS THE YEAR OF THE BEGONIA

The National Garden Bureau has declared 2016 the Year of the Begonia. Begonias have always been one of our favorite plants (I know...I don't have many "non" favorite plants!). But, begonias are truly very easy to grow, can thrive in sun or shade depending on variety, are very forgiving on watering, and are usually very showy! What more could you ask for?

Some of our favorite begonias are: **Rex and Specialty Begonias**, we have several varieties which are great outdoors in shady areas and make great houseplants indoors. We love to make a planter with nothing but Rex Begonias. They don't flower much, but the foliage is stunning and a real showstopper. We have '**Escargot**' which is always a favorite, and great red-leaved varieties that glow in the light. Check out '**Can-Can**' with pink tinged foliage and showy pink flowers! **Dragon Wing Begonias** are versatile, thriving in sun to shade and are one of my go-to hanging baskets for those who struggle. '**Big**' Begonias which have been around for 3 or 4 years are one of our favorites. They are like the begonias you buy in packs, but they are BIG! They do well in pots or the landscape in sun or shade, and are showy and easy!

The **Begonia boliviensis** series, like '**Mistral Red**' and '**Waterfall**', are great for hanging baskets and absolutely thrive in heat. There are also **Solenia Begonias**, **Non-Stop Begonias** and the regular **Wax Begonias** in packs. You can't go wrong with any of them!

If you are planning only one visit to Hasting Plants this year due to distance, may we suggest you plan your visit between
April 15 and May 15
for the best display and selection.



ALL-AMERICA SELECTIONS 2016

All- America Selections winners have been grown, tested, exhibited, and judged in trial gardens all over the United States. They are always a great source for something new each year. Check out more information and color pictures on their web site at www.all-americaselections.org

We just have a couple of new winners we are growing this year, one flower and one vegetable.

- **Salvia ‘Summer Jewel Lavender’** joins it’s siblings as the newest color in the series. The dusty lavender purple blooms are favorites of pollinators in the garden, and even produce seeds that Goldfinch like in the fall. Grows 10-24” tall, blooms from late spring until fall, prefers full sun.
- **Tomato ‘Candyland Red’** is a currant-type tomato. Smaller than cherry tomatoes, they will “pop” right in your mouth straight from the garden. Dark red, sweet flavored fruit forms on the outside of the plant making it easier to harvest.

2016 PERENNIAL PLANT OF THE YEAR

Anemone x hybrid ‘Honorine Jobert’

This Japanese windflower was discovered in 1858 in Verdun, France. It provides an impressive display of single white flowers, with a cluster of bright yellow stamens, on wiry branched stems that are held above the rich deep green foliage. Blooming begins in late summer and lasts until early fall. This Anemone prefers full sun to partial shade, and likes moist soil. It grows 3 to 4 ft. tall. ‘Honorine Jobert’ makes a great addition to your flower bed, since it is a later blooming perennial.

VEGETABLES AND OTHER EDIBLES

We have several new tomatoes for you to try this year. There is a seedless tomato called ‘**Sweet Seedless Hybrid**’, a beefsteak ‘**Beefmaster**’, ‘**Sun Gold**’ which someone said is better than our favorite ‘**Sun Sugar**’, a hybrid form of the Heirloom Brandywine, called ‘**Brandy Man**’, ‘**Mexico Midget**’ which has small cherry type tomatoes, and ‘**Polish Linguisa**’ a large Roma Heirloom.

In the pepper line, we continue to bring you the hottest of the hot peppers, though why anyone would want them, I’ll never know ☺. Our **Carolina Reaper** source from last year fell through. I finally found the seed again at a greatly increased cost, so they will only be available as individual plants ...more expensive from last year I’m sorry to say. We also grew another hot pepper, ‘**Fatalii**’, a shrub like cayenne type, ‘**Bird’s Beak**’, and a tiny hot pepper usually picked green and pickled ‘**Chiltepin**’, ‘**Foiled You**’ a non-hot Jalapeno, and a mild ‘**Tam Jalapeno**’. We also have Hops for any of you home brewers out there – ‘**Chinook Columbia**’ and ‘**Cascade**’. We have the hardest Fig yet, ‘**Chicago Hardy**’, some hardy Cherry Bushes, ‘**Romeo**’ & ‘**Juliet**’, and a couple of Blueberry varieties.

We grew a new **Cabbage ‘Danish Ballhead’** which is great for slaw, and a **Celery** called ‘**Peppermint Stick**’ which has unique bicolored striped red and white stems you can use for fresh seasoning.

We also **grafted tomato plants** again this year. The named varieties are grafted on a rootstock which gives them extra vigor and yield potential. I had some favorable reports from those of you who grew them last year. I started these earlier than I did last year, so they should be ready when the regular varieties are.

PERENNIALS OF NOTE IN 2016

Ok, I have to say it – “one of my favorite plants” is **Peonies** (you know they are ALL my favorites). They bloom early in the spring with huge, glorious colors and have a great shrub-like presence in the garden. This year, I found a new source so I could get some different varieties. I like to build my collection each year, too! We have ‘**Riches & Fame**’, ‘**Moonstone**’, ‘**Eden’s Perfume**’, and ‘**Dancing Butterflies**’. There are others, as well as some great looking Tree Peonies.

Agastache ‘**Mango Tango**’, ‘**Peachie Keen**’ and ‘**Rosie Posie**’ are great for bees, butterflies and hummingbirds. They thrive in hot sunny areas and are fairly drought tolerant. They are even deer resistant... what more could you ask for? Also in that group, we have some great new blue varieties ‘**Blue Boa**’ and ‘**Black Adder**’ which are darker than the “standard”, ‘**Blue Fortune**’. Plant some for the pollinators in your garden.

Bergenia ‘**Dragonfly Sakura**’ has blooms that are 4 times larger than the species. It is a shade plant that reminds me of begonias.

Dicentra ‘**Fire Island**’ is an alpine plant that thrives in full sun with low water. This Fernleaf Bleeding Heart blooms all summer.

We have a lot of great **Heuchera/Coral Bell** varieties. There are dark purple leaves, glowing red leaves and dwarf – ‘**Little Cutie**’ series to choose from. **Heucherella** ‘**Leapfrog**’ has wonderful chartreuse yellow foliage with burgundy markings that just jump out at you.

We have some great **Hostas**. We always carry ‘**Sum & Substance**’ and ‘**Empress Wu**’ which are some of the largest Hostas available. **Hosta** ‘**Royal Wedding**’ boasts large fragrant white blooms, and ‘**Autumn Frost**’ has already been a hit with its frosty blue leaves with wide gold edges.

New to us this year, we have a couple of varieties of dwarf **Crape Myrtle** that provide a lot of summer and fall color.

There are a lot of great mildew resistant Bee Balm. **Monarda** ‘**Leading Lady Lilac and Plum**’, are M. bradburiana which bloom earlier and form petite clumps (10-14”). **Monarda** ‘**Sugar Buzz**’, won’t over run the garden (14-24”) and ‘**Pardon My Cerise, Lavender, Pink and Purple**’ (10-18”) are all great newer varieties of an old favorite. Good for bees, butterflies and hummingbirds!

Phlox ‘**Opening Act Blush**’ and **Phlox** ‘**Opening Act White**’ bloom earlier than other Tall Garden Phlox with a long season of bloom and sporadic re-bloom into fall. Both are very mildew resistant. We also have the Candy series of Phlox touted to be the best mildew resistance to date in four colors ‘**Coral Crème Drop**’, ‘**Bubblegum Pink**’, ‘**Grape Lollipop**’, and ‘**Cotton Candy**’. Another Phlox that is a little smaller and petite, **Phlox** ‘**Jeana**’ is one of the best to attract butterflies and pollinators. We also have ‘**David**’, ‘**Glamour Girl**’ and other favorites.

We have a Red Hot Poker, **Kniphofia** ‘**Echo Rojo**’ that will re-bloom throughout the summer.

There are several great colors of **Echinacea or Coneflowers**, one called **E. ‘Rainbow Marcella**’ that opens tangerine orange and matures to mauve for a multicolor effect. ‘**Double Scoop Cranberry**’ and ‘**Tiki Torch**’ are stand-outs as well.

Everyone is interested in **Milkweed** for the Monarch Butterflies. We have the standard **Asclepiis tuberosa** which is the native orange flowered butterfly weed, as well as **Asclepiis incarnata** ‘**Ice Ballet**’ and ‘**Cinderella**’ the Swamp Milkweed with white and pink flowers,

respectively. Plant some Monarch food!

Black Eyed Susan, **Rudbeckia** ‘**Little Henry**’ is a more compact form of ‘Henry Eilers’ that has unique spoon shaped petals. ‘Little Henry’ grows about 4 ft. tall. We also have the **Giant Rudbeckia** or **Great Coneflower** with large cabbage-like leaves, as well as the ‘**Herbstsonne**’ (Autumn Sun) another great tall blooming variety. I like both of these for their foliage as much as their blooms!

Spigella marlandica, Indian Pinks, is a nice showy native plant for sun, or the edge of a shade garden. Tubular red and yellow flowers are great for butterflies and hummingbirds.

We love **Allium** ‘**Millenium**’ for its ease of growth and lovely rosy purple flowers. We also have **Allium** ‘**Blue Eddy**’ with slightly smaller, lighter flowers, and pinwheel rosettes of foliage that look like swirling water. These are great deer resistant perennials! They are very carefree.

There are a lot of wonderful **Clematis** Vines including ‘**Sweet Summer Love**’ which is a purple version of Sweet Autumn Clematis, and ‘**New Love**’, which is a blue-flowered, bush variety that requires no trellis. Our other premium Clematis varieties are as pretty as I’ve seen before...several are already blooming in the pots!

By request, we have **Calamintha** ‘**Montrose White**’ a very fine textured plant with tiny white flowers resembling Babies Breath. The foliage and growth resemble Catmint. ‘Montrose White’ blooms from June to October. And speaking of **Babies Breath**, we have ‘**Summer Sparkles**’ which doesn’t go dormant, it blooms all summer long. Another long bloomer is **Kalimeris** ‘**Daisy Mae**’ which has with small aster-like white flowers all summer long. It is a great addition to a butterfly garden.

Toad Lily **Tricyrtis** ‘**Sinonome**’ is a great addition to a shade garden since it blooms in the late summer/fall. This one is top rated by the Chicago Botanic Garden and has white flowers with ruby speckling. I love the lovely speckled foliage on these plants as well.

We have the **Pineapple Lillies** again this year, **Echicum**, in three colors. The blooms on these look exactly like pineapples when they first emerge!

There are quite a few flowering shrubs this year. We have some great **Hydrangeas** including a double flowered **Oak-Leaf** variety ‘**Gatsby Star**’, a couple of reblooming **Lilacs**, a couple of **Rose of Sharon**, and lots of tall and short varieties of **Butterfly Bushes**.

There is a great **Red Honeysuckle** ‘**Major Wheeler**’ that is an awesome hummingbird plant, as well as a new Proven Winners **Honeysuckle** ‘**Scentsations**’ with fragrant yellow flowers.

Check out all our grasses, including a new Blue – tinted grass, ‘**Blue Paradise**’ **Little Bluestem**.

We have a spring blooming **Aster** ‘**Dunkle Schone**’ and a fragrant native **Aster** ‘**Raydon’s Favorite**’ that blooms mid to late fall. There is a dependably hardy **Chrysanthemum** ‘**Mammoth Red Daisy**’ and so much more.....

I could go on and on and list every plant we grow here, but you just have to come discover the rest of the treasures yourself!


